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The Seven Feasts of the Lord

Scripture: Leviticus 23:1-44

Leviticus is the third book of Moses written as a primer for the moral and ethical instruction of the chosen people of God. It contains civil, sanitary, ceremonial, moral, and religious regulations for the nation of Israel.

All the offerings, ceremonies and laws served to constantly remind Israel that God was eminently holy. God could be approached only by the priests, and then only in strict obedience to the detailed instructions for purification. God required the sacrifice of innocent animals for the covering of man's sin.

These sacrifices were symbolic of the ultimate sacrifice which would take away the sin of the whole world. (John 1:29) <

Purpose: They tell of God's redemptive plan for Israel. These Seven Feasts are holidays (holy days) instituted by God. They are discussed throughout the Old and New Testaments.

However, only in one place, *Leviticus 23*, are all seven holidays listed in chronological order. As Christians and a nation, we observe holidays instituted by men, and it is not inappropriate to do so. However, God instituted only seven holidays.

The Hebrew word, *feasts*, means "appointed times." The sequence and timing of these feasts or holidays have been carefully orchestrated by God. Collectively, they tell the story of redemption. These feasts are also called **holy convocations**; that is, they are intended to be times of meeting between God and man for holy purposes.

The seven feasts are: (Leviticus 23:1-44) <

- 1. The Feast of Passover "Pesach" (verse 5) <
- 2. The Feast of Unleavened Bread "Hag HaMatzot" (verses 6-8) <
- 3. The Feast of First Fruits "Yom Habikkurim" (verses 10-11) <
- 4. The Feast of Pentecost "Shavuot" (verses 15-17) <
- 5. The Feast of Trumpets "Yom Teruah" (verse 24) <
- 6. The Feast of The Day of Atonement "Yom Kippur" (verse 27) <
- 7. The Feast of Tabernacles "Sukkot" (Booths) (verses 39-43) <

The first four feasts *have been fulfilled* in the Lord Jesus Christ in connection with His first coming. They occur in the spring. Passover, Unleavened Bread, and First Fruits occur in the Hebrew month of Nisan (March/April). The Feast of Weeks (Pentecost) occurs fifty days later in the Hebrew month of Sivan (May/June).

These first four feasts are history, that is, they occurred almost two thousand years ago. Their spiritual benefits continue forward to the present Church Age through the sacrificial work of Christ on the cross.

The final three feasts occur in the fall of the year within the Hebrew month of Tishri (mid September or October). These three events depict events associated with the Lord Jesus Christ's second coming, our blessed hope. (Titus 2:11-15) <

Important Points:

- 1. These feasts were given to Israel not the church.
- 2. They are closely tied to Israel's spring and fall agricultural seasons. When the feasts were instituted, Israel was largely an agricultural nation dependent on God for daily provisions.
- 3. The timing of these feasts is based on the Jewish lunar (moon) calendar of 354 days/year. It is 11 days shorter than our 365 day solar year. Seven times every nineteen years, the Jewish calendar has a thirteenth month. If this were not the case, after a few years, winter would occur in summer, and summer would occur in the winter. It is for this reason these holidays do not fall on the same day as our Gregorian (solar) calendar each year.
- 4. The sequence and timing of these feasts are a shadow of the Lord's redemptive plan. (Colossians 2:16-17) < They commence with Passover, the very day Jesus voluntarily gave Himself as a sacrifice for the sins of the world and climax with the one thousand year messianic Kingdom. (Revelation 20:4) <
- 5. The participation of Gentiles in the blessing associated with the feasts of God appointed for Israel should come as no surprise, "and in your seed all the nations of the earth shall be blessed". (Genesis 22:18) <
- 6. All of humanity has been extended an invitation to meet God on His terms. (John 3:16) + (1 Timothy 2:3-4) <
- 7. All Jewish males were required to go to Jerusalem to appear before the Lord for 3 of these feasts;
 - 1. Unleavened Bread. 2. Weeks. 3. Tabernacles. (Deut.16:16) <

Each major event of the Messiah's first coming literally occurred on the precise date of the appropriate Jewish holiday during His first coming in the spring of that year.

- He was crucified on Passover.
- He was placed in the grave on the Feast of Unleavened Bread.
- He was resurrected on the Feast of First fruits. (1Cor.15:20) <
- He ascended to His Father and ten days later sent the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.


Each of the three major events to be associated with His second coming will, likewise, fall on the appropriate Jewish holiday during the fall of the year.

Those three feasts:

- Trumpets: Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Matt. 24:31)
- Day of Atonement: Salvation of Israel. (Zechariah 12:10-11, Romans 11:25-27)
- Tabernacles: Establishment of His Messianic Kingdom.
 (Zechariah 14:1-9, Rev. 20:1-6)

In between the spring feasts - which occurred almost two thousand years ago - and the fall feasts - is the Church Age during which we are now living.

As a believer living during the church age, what is your appointed time? See 2 Cori.5:10 <



Leviticus Chapter 23. - (back)

Leviticus Chapter 23 - (NASB)

- 1. verse 5 In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at twilight is the LORD'S Passover. (back)
- 2. verses 6-8

 6'Then on the fifteenth day of the same month there is the Feast of Unleavened Bread to the LORD; for seven days you shall eat unleavened bread. 7'On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall not do any laborious work. 8'But for seven days you shall present an offering by fire to the LORD. On the seventh day is a holy convocation; you shall not do any laborious work." (back)
- 3. verses 10-11 10"Speak to the sons of Israel and say to them, 'When you enter the land which I am going to give to you and reap its harvest, then you shall bring in the sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest to the priest. 11 He shall wave the sheaf before the LORD for you to be accepted; on the day after the sabbath the priest shall wave it. (back)
- 4. verses 15-17 15'You shall also count for yourselves from the day after the sabbath, from the day when you brought in the sheaf of the wave offering; there shall be seven complete sabbaths. 16'You shall count fifty days to the day after the seventh sabbath; then you shall present a new grain offering to the LORD. 17'You shall bring in from your dwelling places two *loaves* of bread for a wave offering, made of two-tenths *of an ephah;* they shall be of a fine flour, baked with leaven as first fruits to the LORD. (back)

- 5. verse 24 **24** "Speak to the sons of Israel, saying, 'In the seventh month on the first of the month you shall have a rest, a reminder by blowing *of trumpets*, a holy convocation. (back)
- 6. verse 27 **27**"On exactly the tenth day of this seventh month is the day of atonement; it shall be a holy convocation for you, and you shall humble your souls and present an offering by fire to the LORD. (back)
- 7. Verses 39-43 39'On exactly the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the crops of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the LORD for seven days, with a rest on the first day and a rest on the eighth day. 40'Now on the first day you shall take for yourselves the foliage of beautiful trees, palm branches and boughs of leafy trees and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the LORD your God for seven days. 41'You shall thus celebrate it as a feast to the LORD for seven days in the year. It shall be a perpetual statute throughout your generations; you shall celebrate it in the seventh month. 42'You shall live in booths for seven days; all the native-born in Israel shall live in booths, 43so that your generations may know that I had the sons of Israel live in booths when I brought them out from the land of Egypt. I am the LORD your God." (back)

This *is* the first resurrection. 6Blessed and holy *is* he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years.

1 Behold, a day is coming for the LORD when the spoil taken from you will be divided among you. 2 For I will gather all the nations against Jerusalem to battle, and the city will be captured, the houses plundered, the women ravished and half of the city exiled, but the rest of the people will not be cut off from the city. 3 Then the LORD will go forth and fight against those nations, as when He fights on a day of battle. 4 In that day His feet will stand on the Mount of Olives, which is in front of Jerusalem on the east; and the Mount of Olives will be split in its middle from east to west by a very large valley, so that half of the mountain will move toward the north and the other half toward the south. 5 You will flee by the valley of My mountains, for the valley of the mountains will reach to Azel; yes, you will flee just as you fled before the earthquake in the days of Uzziah king of Judah.
